Dear sir,

I am the Program Coordinator for the Bioterrorism Consortium of Lake Michigan. Our consortium is made up of Public Health agencies from 8 counties , 3 tribes and one city health Department. The counties are: Brown, Door, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Marinette, Menominee, Oconto, Shawano, and the Tribes of Menominee, Oneida Nation and Stockbridge-Munsee, and the city of De Pere. We were established in 2003 to prepare for any public health emergency that may happen and are one of 11 consortia in the state. We receive our funding from the Centers for Disease Control. One of our ongoing objectives has been to have four tiers of redundant communication. We began looking into 2-way radio's in the summer of 2007. Our office attended a presentation that was at Lambeau Field and became intrigued with the Motorola Turbo. I contacted Baycom and set up a time for a sales rep to come and discuss all the radio's with our communication committee. Randy Krull came to speak to our committee on all the radio's (i.e., type, functionality, different bands, etc). We also did our homework and spoke with a Kenwood dealer. After both presentation's Motorola appeared to be by far the superior radio. I requested to "test" the Motorola TURBO.
